- ~ To the community: vast partnerships, website, social media, focus stories in local media and presentations at community events.

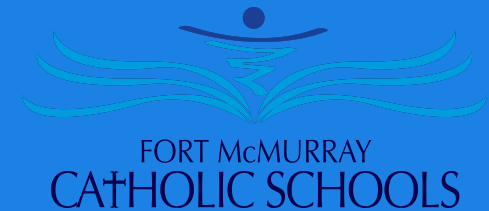
Our Students:
