This personalized attention fosters a deep sense of belonging and motivation.

While offering the full Alberta high school curriculum, IHM also provides a broad range of engaging elective options, including learning strategies, physical education, psychology, forensics, and job safety. We also offer preparation classes for a Registered Apprenticeship Program. This variety ensures students have opportunities to explore personal interests and career pathways.

Flexible attendance agreements, access to technology, career counseling, and partnerships with community services help remove barriers to success and support students' academic and personal growth.


As we look ahead in our three-year education plan, our focus remains clear: to nurture resilient, compassionate learners who will go forward to live not only with purpose—but with faith.

THEME 1: FAITH FIRST



Students and staff will experience a Catholic faith-inspired formation by opening their minds to learning, their hearts to love, and their hands to service, reflecting the path of the Saints.

• Aligning with Our Faith Theme: Live Like a Saint, explore the lives and teachings of the Saints as examples of individuals who embodied lifelong learning and curiosity, inspiring students and staff to approach knowledge with open minds.

STRATEGIES

- Celebrate students who reflect the qualities of highlighted Saints, our Divisions Core Values at quarterly awards.
- Continue to foster opportunities for staff and students to grow and celebrate their faith through our relationship with the church, monthly liturgies in the classroom, and visual prayers posted in the classroom (screen/posters).

THEME 2: WELLNESS MATTERS



Students and staff achieve physical, mental, and spiritual wellness through a culture of kindness, connection, and personal growth.

STRATEGIES

Students will become critical thinkers and ethical problem-solvers, equipped to take informed and meaningful action in a complex world.

- Continue implementing the four-quarter system and tracking credit recovery to increase course completion rates.
- Enhance instruction and assessment practices that challenge students to analyze, evaluate, synthesize information, and apply knowledge in novel and complex ways.
- Foster engaging, hands-on, and experiential learning opportunities that challenge students to think critically and solve complex problems.
- Implement a framework on the ethical and practical use of artificial intelligence (AI), facilitating the thoughtful exploration and integration of AI to support students' critical thinking, problem-solving, and informed engagement.

- Expand professional learning opportunities focused on Indigenous histories, perspectives, and Truth and Reconciliation for all staff.
- Foster authentic and reciprocal partnerships with local Indigenous communities and Elders.
- Advance reconciliation by embedding the education-related Calls to Action from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission through culturally responsive practice and pursuing equitable outcomes.

Students will participate in an inclusive school environment where their faiths, cultures, backgrounds, identities, and experiences are valued and enrich the school community.

STRATEGIES

- Build upon existing efforts to enhance cultural and diversity programs and events that
 celebrate the unique backgrounds within our community and foster meaningful crosscultural connections—planning and implementing a Multi-Cultural Celebration and
 increasing awareness of various cultural days of importance to our students.
- As a staff, commit to inclusion and equity in the principles of Catholic Social Teachings, recognizing the inherent dignity of every person and our call to build a just and caring community where all belong.
- Foster a more connected and inclusive school community by prioritizing the development of self-awareness, celebrating the richness of diverse lived experiences.
