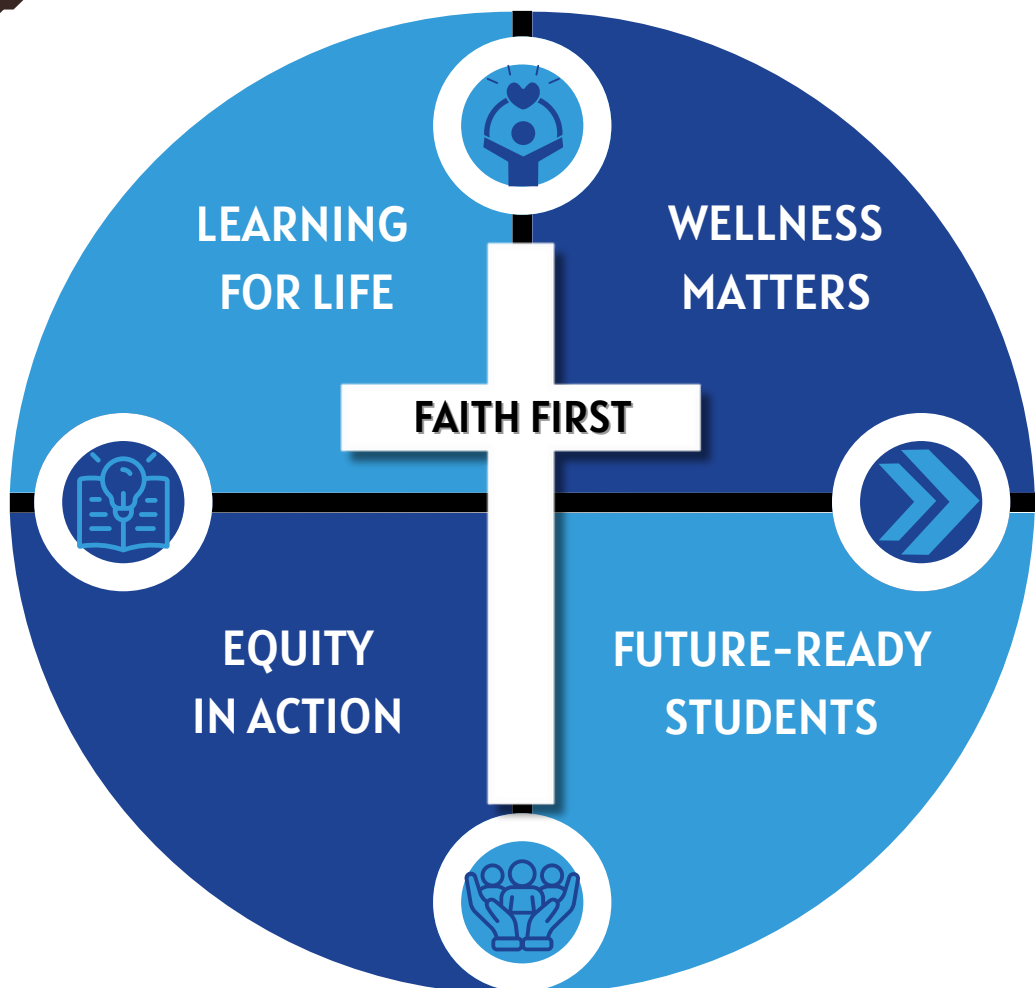

2025-28 DIVISION STRATEGIC PRIORITIES



THEME 1: FAITH FIRST

OUTCOME A

Students will grow as faith leaders by deepening their understanding of Catholic teachings and the liturgical calendar while engaging in meaningful acts of service that foster a sense of compassion, connection, and responsibility within their local community.

- Increase opportunities for structured liturgies and full Mass experiences to strengthen students' understanding and connection to their Catholic faith.
- Establish a Faith Formation Team composed of teachers and students to collaboratively lead liturgies and coordinate up to two school-based local social initiatives each year to include the Division Wide Faith Theme centered around Saints.
- Enhance regular and meaningful connections between the parish and school to provide pastoral support and opportunities for staff and students to connect with clergy.
- Increase opportunities for whole-school prayer, intentional connections to Scripture, and classroom prayer intentions to foster a deeper sense of faith, unity, and spirituality within the school community.

STRATEGIES

OUTCOME B

As a school community (including families, students, staff, and stakeholders) we will deepen our spiritual understanding of the Catholic faith through meaningful experiences that take place both during the school day and in activities that extend beyond regular school hours.

- Enhance parental engagement by providing intentional opportunities for families to deepen their understanding of the sacraments and Catholic practices through the active participation of their children.
- Broaden immersive spiritual experiences to include families and community members, fostering a stronger sense of shared faith and connection beyond the school environment.

STRATEGIES



THEME 2: WELLNESS MATTERS

OUTCOME A

Students will foster a strong sense of connection and collective pride by recognizing and sharing their unique gifts and talents, contributing meaningfully to the growth and success of the school community.

- Implement a school-wide reinforcement system that acknowledges and celebrates students who demonstrate empathy, respect, and positive relationships within both classroom and school settings.
- Provide meaningful academic opportunities that explicitly teach skills and practices promoting connectivity, inclusion, and a shared sense of belonging.
- Celebrate student and staff achievements on a monthly basis through engaging, community-building activities that strengthen relationships between staff and students.
- Offer a range of extracurricular activities spanning physical, spiritual, and academic domains, facilitated collaboratively by staff and community volunteers, to engage students in meaningful and inclusive experiences.

STRATEGIES

OUTCOME B

The school community , including staff, families, and students, will foster a culture of kindness and connection, actively engaging in collaborative experiences that promote personal growth, mutual respect, and a strong sense of belonging.

- Increasing family engagement through volunteer opportunities and shared celebrations that promote unity.
- Introducing a variety of family events, both within and beyond the school, to strengthen relationships and build a sense of belonging.
- Hosting multiple staff events each year that offer diverse activities and experiences, supporting staff well-being and collaboration.

STRATEGIES



THEME 3: FUTURE-READY STUDENTS

OUTCOME A

Students and staff will cultivate a sense of collective responsibility by fostering empathy, respect, and meaningful connections that honor and value the individual differences of all members of the school community.

- Utilize restorative approaches to provide students with authentic opportunities to resolve conflicts through guided conversations and purposeful actions, fostering accountability and mutual respect.
- Engage students, staff, and parents in the co-creation of a shared Student Code of Conduct that promotes responsibility, mutual respect, and a collective understanding of expectations to support readiness for learning.

STRATEGIES

- Provide students with cross-graded leadership opportunities in literacy, numeracy, and wellness activities, fostering collaboration, mentorship, and shared responsibility for learning and community well-being.
- Establish clear and consistent communication routines with key stakeholders to address student actions, their impact on others, and opportunities for growth and reflection.
- Provide timely and transparent reporting of academic successes and challenges to students and parents, fostering shared accountability and supporting continued academic growth and responsibility.

OUTCOME B

Students will deepen their understanding of diverse career pathways by recognizing the transferability of their skills and interests, engaging in scaffolded opportunities across various domains.

- Provide students with biannual opportunities to participate in CTF programs that emphasize safety, skill application, and early exploration of potential career pathways.
- Facilitate access to a variety of community resources and hands-on experiences that promote practical skill development alongside academic growth.

STRATEGIES

- Establish a whole-school responsibility program where each class and student takes ownership for the care and maintenance of the Father Beauregard School building
- Collaborate with the Inclusive Living Program to ensure students with diverse learning needs are meaningfully included in social and academic experiences during the introduction of career pathway opportunities.
- Host targeted engagement sessions for families of transitioning students, in collaboration with local Catholic middle and high schools, to support informed decision-making and promote continuity in faith-based education.

THEME 4: LEARNING FOR LIFE

OUTCOME A

Students will enhance their literacy and mathematical understanding, skills, and procedural knowledge to confidently analyze, solve, and apply solutions to real-world problems across a variety of contexts.

- Utilize thorough interpretation of results from yearly numeracy and literacy assessments to inform instructional planning.
- Develop and curate high-quality resources to enhance, review, and provide ongoing practice of skills introduced during whole-class instruction.
- Implement targeted interventions in literacy and numeracy that address academic, social, emotional and behavioural needs of students.

STRATEGIES

- Establish clear progress monitoring timelines to track student growth in literacy and numeracy across the school year.
- Foster regular collaboration among teachers and support staff to share insights, refine strategies, and promote a collective understanding of students' diverse learning needs across classes and grade levels.
- Ongoing professional development with divisional consultants to enhance instructional resources and ensure comprehensive, high-quality delivery of instruction that supports longitudinal growth across key curricular areas.

OUTCOME B

Strengthen collaboration with parents by promoting a shared understanding of student achievement indicators in literacy and numeracy, supporting the continuous reinforcement and application of skills between school and home environments.

- Offer monthly parent sessions, incorporating external expertise and resources, to support academic, social, and spiritual development that aligns with classroom instruction and targeted outcomes.
- Host evening family events that showcase grade-level literacy and numeracy strategies, providing parents with practical ways to support their child's learning.
- Provide accessible at-home literacy and numeracy resources, such as home reading programs, UFLI-based materials, and grade-appropriate math practice activities, to strengthen the connection between school and home learning.

STRATEGIES



THEME 5: EQUITY IN ACTION

OUTCOME A

Students will achieve academic success through tailored supports and services that maximize learning for all.

- Provide ongoing professional development for teachers to enhance instructional practices that address varying levels of student need, including the integration of artificial intelligence tools to support differentiated instruction and data-informed decision-making.
- Provide ongoing professional development and embedded release time for staff to design, implement, and refine individualized wellness plans and targeted classroom management strategies that address the diverse academic, social, and behavioral needs of students.
- Utilize online learning tools to collect data, set targeted goals, and share progress reports for students with complex needs, ensuring consistent communication and collaboration among teachers, students, and families.
- Leverage the Essentials for Living framework to strengthen assessment, instruction, and reporting practices for students in Inclusive Living Programs, ensuring a consistent and comprehensive approach to skill development and reporting.
- Expand opportunities for students in the Inclusive Education Program, particularly those with high complexity, to engage meaningfully in classroom and school-wide learning experiences that foster belonging and inclusion.

STRATEGIES

OUTCOME B

Students will engage in an inclusive school environment where their faith, culture, background, identity, and lived experiences are honored and celebrated, contributing to the richness and vibrancy of the school community.

- Allocate time and resources for a dedicated staff working group to plan and coordinate up to three annual events that celebrate faith-based and cultural traditions, fostering inclusion and community engagement.
- Create meaningful, student-led opportunities to engage in social justice initiatives that positively impact and support the local community.
- Expand opportunities for school-wide and community-based events that celebrate and honour Indigenous cultures, deepening understanding and fostering reconciliation.
- Increase the intentional inclusion of community guests and speakers who reflect diverse backgrounds and experiences, ensuring students are exposed to a wide range of perspectives and voices.
