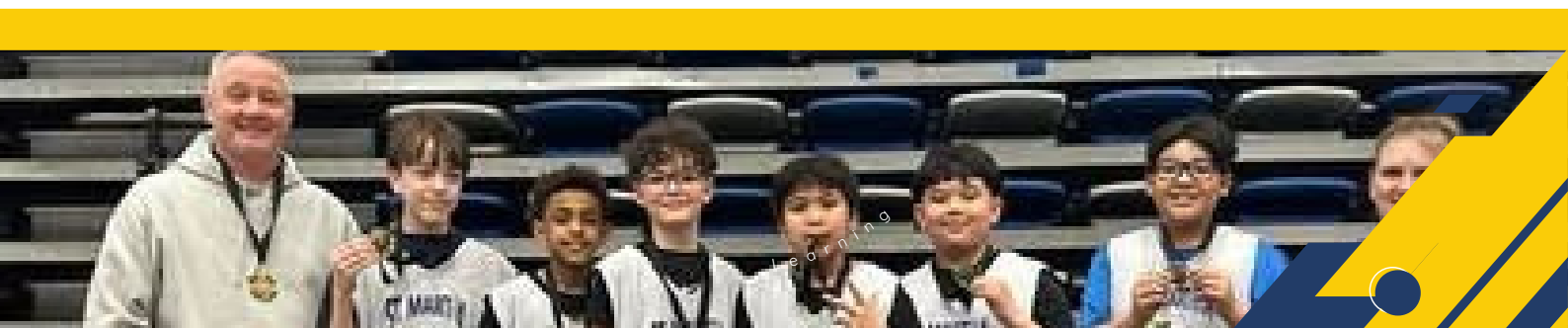

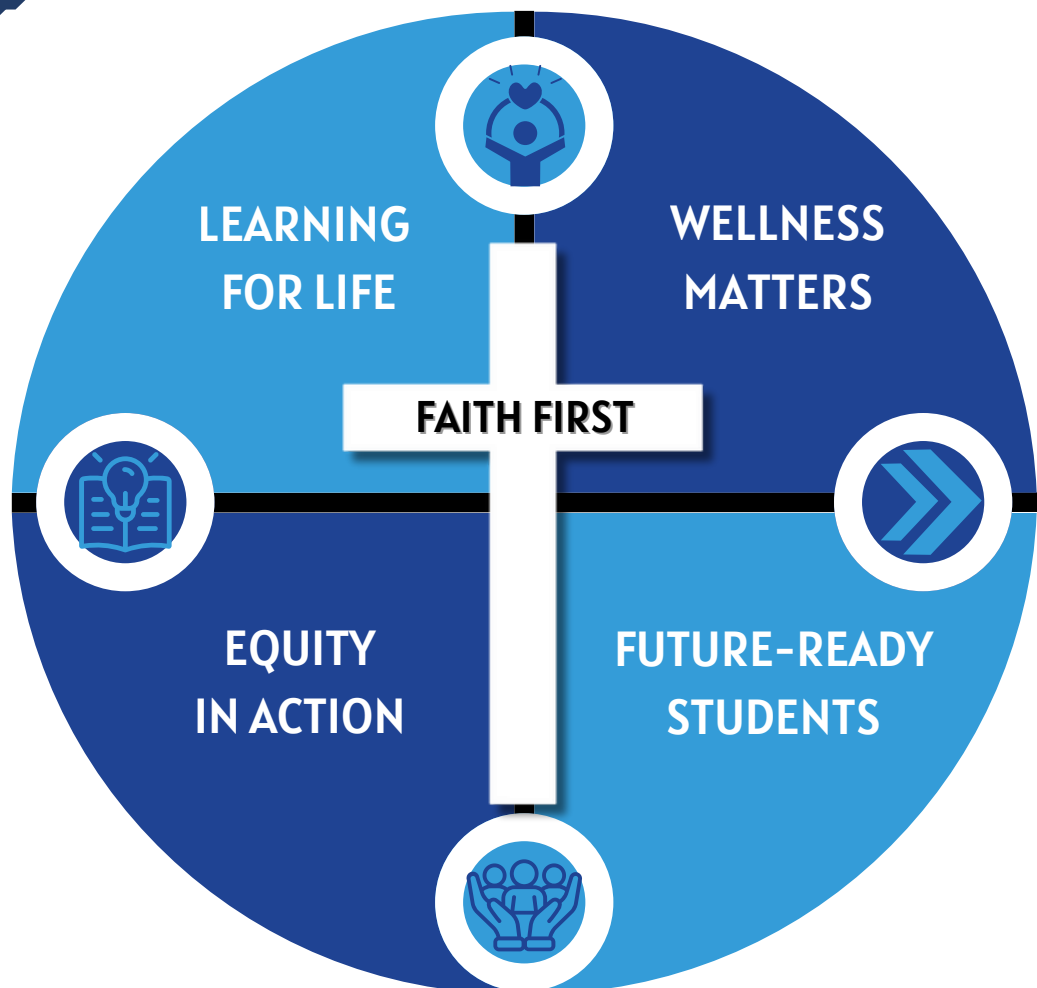

2025-28 DIVISION STRATEGIC PRIORITIES



THEME 1: FAITH FIRST

OUTCOME A

Students and staff will experience a Catholic faith-inspired formation by opening their minds to learning, their hearts to love, and their hands to service, reflecting the path of the Saints.

- Learning about the Saints in the classroom
- Increase student-led faith initiatives and leadership in liturgies

OUTCOME A

Students will cultivate personal excellence in literacy and numeracy, becoming empowered and engaged lifelong learners.

STRATEGIES

- Promote and support high-quality, evidence-based instructional practices in literacy and numeracy.
- Offer targeted and relevant school-based professional learning opportunities that enhance instructional practices in literacy and numeracy, specifically knowledge and application of intervention strategies to support students' literacy development.
- Continue to build teacher capacity to interpret and apply data and progress monitoring, ensuring it actively informs daily classroom decisions and supports student learning.



THEME 5: EQUITY IN ACTION

OUTCOME A

Students will achieve academic success through tailored supports and services that maximize learning for all.

STRATEGIES

- Support the practical application and effectiveness of ISP, ISSP, and IPP documents.
- Expand the capacity of teachers to differentiate instruction and implement universal learning principles to enhance accessible and engaging learning environments.

OUTCOME B

All students will be supported through inclusive practices that honour and reflect diverse identities, needs, and experiences.

STRATEGIES

- Ground the jurisdiction's commitment to inclusion and equity in the principles of Catholic Social Teachings, recognizing the inherent dignity of every person and our call to build a just and caring community where all belong.
- Foster a culturally responsive school community through foundational Indigenous education, service projects, and community relationships
